

## **Family of Numbers**




There are 3 members in a family (like a dad, mom, and baby)

#### Steps to Use Each Time:

#### Steps to Follow in Determining the Place Value of the Number

- 1. Is the number a ones, tens or hundreds?
- 2. Which family is it in?
- 3. Add 0 for all the places on the right within the family in order to determine the value.
- 4. Add a 0 for all the places on the right, including all of the families in order to write the number.
- 5. What do you have to separate the families with?

#### **Steps to Follow when Reading the Number**

- 1. Start at the place you would when reading a sentence-from left to right.
- 2. Read the numbers together within the family, because families like to stay together.
- 3. Then, read the next family
- 4. Read until you have read all of the family of numbers.

#### **Steps to Follow when Writing a Number**

- 1. Focus on the first family you hear.
- 2. How many numbers are there in each family?
  - a. How many hundreds?
  - b. How many tens?
  - c. How many ones?
- 3. Write down the numbers as you go.
- 4. Do this for all the families.
- 5. Read all three numbers together and then say the family name for each family.
